It is so important to keep aid flowing to the survivors we have all been helping over the years, because if we stop, they will quickly spiral back into poverty.

On our expedition, we also found new survivors in desperate need, like Riva Katz (pictured below) who lives in a drafty, decrepit old hut in a small village.



During our visit, Riva had to stoke the 100-year-old stove several times as she could not keep warm.

We immediately supplied her with financial aid to start the process of getting medical help and having the windows and doors of her hut repaired before the harsh winter comes.

The survivors who are new to us are just beginning the incredible journey of healing and compassion that others have experienced due to your kindness. We need to keep helping them too. All survivors



need our continued care. It's as simple as that.

A more hopeful Riva sees us off, wishing us a safe journey.
