His voice was trembling and he could not stop his tears. He cried with joy. And I wept too after receiving the news. I could not regain my composure for a long time. The weather that day was terrible, a nasty rain, but the sun was shining for us, we were so excited and happy!"

Sadly, help came too late. Boris passed away shortly thereafter. We are happy that in his last days he knew he was cared for and not forgotten, but he is a reminder of how crucial and timely our aid is. Types of Bequests:

General, Unrestricted: Apply your funds wherever the need is greatest at the time.

<u>Restricted:</u> Apply funds for a specific purpose, such as Holocaust Education.

IRA or other Retirement Plans: Name The Survivor Mitzvah Project on your retirement plan's "Beneficiary Designation Form."

<u>Contingency Gift:</u> Should you outlive one of your beneficiaries, the bequest that had been specified for that beneficiary would go to The Survivor Mitzvah Project.

Residuary Bequest: To leave The Survivor Mitzvah Project what's left in your estate after all costs and bequests to loved ones have been satisfied.

<u>3. ENDOWMENT FUNDS:</u> Set up an endowment at any time to make a perpetual, annual investment in the mission of The Survivor Mitzvah Project. Help us bring aid to survivors now and preserve their stories for future generations.

As you know, the need is immediate and critical. As some survivors pass away, we discover others who need help. Our project keeps growing. We are also finding more survivors who were children during the war; born of starved mothers, raised with post war deprivations. Without protein and proper nutrition growing up, these survivors, who are now in their late 70s and 80s, are prematurely frail and suffering from increased and complicated medical issues.

For each \$18,000 we receive, we can help 120 survivors for one month or 10 survivors for an entire year!

For each \$180,000 we receive, we can help 1200 survivors for one month or 100 survivors for an entire year!
