



As the Survivors age into their 80s and 90s, their sight can rapidly diminish. These elderly men and women living in Belarus, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania, Moldova, Transnistria, Ukraine, and Russia, have no savings and no health insurance to cover the \$2000 it takes to restore their vision. After struggling to pay for food, medicine, heat and shelter, there is nothing left. And so they lose what little they have – their sight.

Today the need is greater than ever.
